Our Programs

Church Programs & Services

Spiritual growth is an ongoing process that can be developed through the various programs and services offered at the Yuba Sutter Corps. With Sunday services, men and women's bible studies and youth programs for kids, there is something for everyone. Fellowship renders unity.



Family Service



With the Relief from Energy Assistance through Community Help (REACH) and the Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) and United Way Funds, a yearly average of 12,300 local individuals have been helped with: Rental Assistance, Food Assistance, Utility Assistance, Temporary Shelter, Seasonal: Food Baskets & Toys.

Open Door Wellness & Recovery Center

The Open Door Wellness and Recovery Center is designed to help meet the needs of adults with mental illness, who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. This drop-in center provides them with a safe place to spend their days. The participants also receive transportation to doctor appointments and other local sites.

The Depot Family Crisis Center

The Depot has given hundreds of families a place to reconstruct their lives after the trauma of homelessness. After six months of intensive counseling and case management, Depot graduates leave with a clear understanding of what caused their problems, tools that will help them to avoid making the same mistakes, and support systems to help maintain their new lifestyle.

Transitional Housing Program

This is a gated community with eight two bedroom homes available to Depot graduates. Families will continue to participate in all the supportive services the Depot offers, while at the same time begin to develop a sense of independence and personal responsibility.



Cold Weather Shelter

We provide temporary shelter to 25 homeless families and blanket them with a host of supportive services. The goal of this project is to move families toward permanent housing and self-sufficiency. The program runs December through March.

Emergency Disaster Services



We stand ready to respond in the event of an emergency. When called upon, we provide support to workers and victims during times of

disaster. Services include meals, clean-up and recovery, emergency communication and spiritual ministry.
