Organization Function at the National Level:

- Provides Red Cross staff to work daily at DHS/FEMA regional offices in support of ESF #6 Mass Care activities.
- Provides specially trained liaisons to work at designated DHS/FEMA locations to support ESF #6 Mass Care activities as requested.
- Provides subject matter expertise on regulations, policy, and all relevant American Red Cross issues including general mass care planning, preparedness, and response, and recovery activities, as well as Red Cross-specific activities in these areas.
- Provides information on current Red Cross mass care activities as requested prior to and during response operations.
- Supports DHS/FEMA in working with designated State lead agencies for mass care in planning preparedness and response activities, to include exercise participation.
- Provides guidance to designated State lead agency for mass care as the State determines its needs for Federal resource support.
- Promotes cooperation and coordination among government and national-level NGOs that provide mass care services and appropriate government entities engaged in planning for response to major disasters.
- Works on a case-by-case basis with DHS/FEMA on transient accommodations to eligible disaster victims.
- Supports reunification efforts through its 'Safe and Well' website and in coordination with government entities as appropriate. Facilitates and supports re-unification programs in general population shelters operated by ARC.
- Promotes public information sharing through its website (www.redcross.org), National Response Center, and "Safe and Well" website.

The American Red Cross' role as the Nation's largest mass care service provider is separate and distinct from its role in the National Response Framework. As the nation's largest mass care service provider, the American Red Cross provides sheltering, feeding, bulk distribution of needed items, basic first aid, welfare information and casework, among other services, at the local level as needed. In this its role as a service provider, the American Red Cross works closely with State and local, tribal, and State governments to provide

mass care services to victims of every disaster, large and small, in an affected area. In providing these services, the American Red Cross fulfills its humanitarian mission, acting on its own behalf and not on behalf of the Federal Government or any other governmental entity.

Local California Function:

Disaster Mission:

The American Red Cross, a humanitarian organization led by volunteers, guided by its Congressional Charter and the Fundamental Principles of the International Red Cross Movement, will provide Relief to victims of disasters and help people prevent, prepare for, and respond to emergencies.

Preparedness / Readiness Capabilities:

The Red Cross provides free community disaster education training for home, school, work, and community preparedness, for both groups and individuals. The Red Cross produces several brochures and other literature available for distribution that details how to make emergency plans, build preparedness kits, and make individuals and groups better prepared to serve their communities following disasters. The Red Cross is an ongoing participant in virtually all local, regional, and statewide disaster readiness activities, most notably care and shelter readiness and planning activities.

Emergency Response/Relief:

The Red Cross plays a critical role in the National Response Plan for all major disaster responses. The ARC's primary role in the initial phases of a disaster response is to provide care and shelter to those displaced and affected by the disaster, including feeding, health, and mental health services. Soon after the initial emergency phases, the ARC often provides direct financial assistance to assist in meeting the immediate needs of those affected by disaster.

The Red Cross also feeds disaster victims and emergency workers, handles inquiries from concerned immediate family members outside the disaster-affected area, provides blood and blood products to disaster victims to other available resources.

Organization's role in and/or resources available for Long Term Recovery:

The Red Cross may also help those needing long-term recovery assistance when all other available resources, including insurance, government, private, and community assistance, are either unavailable or inadequate to meet the needs. The Red Cross is an active member of local long-term recovery committees.

Organization Function at the National Level:

- Provides more than 200 mobile feeding units staffed by volunteers who can prepare and distribute thousands of meals a day.
- Provides disaster child care; the agency has several mobile child care units.
- Assists with clean-up activities, temporary repairs, reconstruction, counseling, and bilingual services.

Local California Function:

Organization’s Disaster Mission:

In the midst of great pain, sorrow, loss, and trauma created by a natural or man made disaster the CA Southern Baptist Convention Disaster Relief responds to not only an opportunity, but also a clear responsibility to address the physical, emotional, material, social, and spiritual needs of hurting individuals.

Preparedness / Readiness Capabilities:

The CSBC Disaster Relief partners with other community organizations in the voluntary disaster service and delivery system, local, state, national, and international. The CSBC Disaster Relief preparedness and readiness capabilities are based on the training and skills of the volunteers and staff. The trained personnel receive their training in a variety of fields: mobile feeding, child care, chaplaincy, communication, and sanitation.

Some of the other areas of work are advisory/advocacy, airlift kitchen, casework, damage assessment, assistance, interpreters, employment assistance, legal aid, security, shelter care, and transportation

Emergency Response/Relief:

The CSBC Disaster Relief draws from over 2000 volunteers trained in California in the different areas of response: mobilize personnel and equipment to provide leadership and participate in liaisons with

partnerships with governmental agencies, disaster relief agencies, community organizations and churches with the purpose of providing comfort, care, resources to assist individuals and families in their loss and in their recovery.

NOTE: If the disaster is large we can ask for help from North American Mission Board and other state conventions.

Food service:

5 MFK capability of preparing 20,000 meals per day. Can step up a higher meal count with extra cooking equipment.

Prepare meals for the American Red Cross and the Salvation Army – using either our field kitchens or theirs.

Shower & Laundry Units are deployed along with mobile field kitchens. The unit will be stationed close to the MFK or shelter to be used by those working or in shelters.

Mobile Child Care Unit – deployed with the MFK. Can be set up for families in shelters or those doing paper work.

Communication Unit - deployed with MFK – set up close to kitchen for communication with other organizations and suppliers to keep flow of supplies to the MFK.

Chaplaincy – A chaplain will be deployed with each disaster team. This person will be available to all volunteers, other workers, and those being served in the disaster. The chaplain will be in charge of a de-briefing session each night that a team is activated.

Organization's role in and/or resources available for Long Term Recovery:

Short Term: Is for servicing the individual homes or properties that have been damaged by a disaster and protect and secure it from any further damage.

Long Term: This is help in the individual or families in preparing paper work needed for clean up of their properties to hasten the process to begin recovery. Then our volunteers go in and assist in the clean up. Examples: mud outs, floods, fires, winds, storms, earthquakes, and land slides. We have trained personnel for these activities.

VOABA will provide both short-term and long term recovery through case management services to effected individuals and families.

Preparedness / Readiness Capabilities:

Provides ongoing training to our case managers so they are ready to respond in the event of a crisis, with local resources/information to aid in an expedited recovery

Emergency Response/Relief:

Once survivors of a catastrophe have been identified by first responders, it is our goal to provide local information (shelter, emergency funds, food, etc.) concerning recovery within 48-72 hours of the disaster.

Organization's role in and/or resources available for Long Term Recovery:

Needs Assessment – trained and supervised case managers, along with volunteers are available to complete Individual Service Plans (ISPs) and determine the next steps to recovery. We are currently a part of a Bay Area and national network of partner resources.

ISP – Individual Service Plans are immediately implemented to start the process of recovery and sustainability. This includes everything from housing, jobs, food, to health and mental health services, etc. with a goal of sustainability.

Post-disaster Follow-up – Once the survivor has reached a level of sustainability we provide “personal” case management services from six (6) months to one (1) year to ensure each individual becomes a viable part of society, both mentally and financially.
